







## Bible Passage:

Micah [1:3-5] 5:2-5a; 6:6-8

## Key Verse:

What does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

Micah 6:8

Note: This activity was created for our upcoming Living the Word: Kids (PK-2nd) guide for November 11, 2018.

Do Justice and Love Kindness

Think about ways you can do justice and love kindness by serving others.

You will need:

- **†** Whiteboard or mural paper
- **†** Paper
- **†** Scissors
- **†** Black marker
- **†** Crayons
- **†** Glue sticks

## Preparation:

 Cut several pieces of paper into strips (8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" inches wide by 3 inches long).

## Instructions:

- 1. In Micah 6:8, we are commanded to "do justice and love kindness." This means that God wants us to love other people and help them when they need it.
- 2. Give each participant a couple strips of paper. One way that we can show love to other people is by helping them. Who are some people who need our help the

**most?** [Answers will vary, but may include: people who are homeless, hungry, refugees, lonely, elderly, sick, those hit by natural disasters.]

- 3. What are some ways we can help people? Let's make a list.
- 4. Take ideas from participants and write them down on the whiteboard or paper. Answers may include sharing food or toys, giving a hug to someone, helping them with a project or task, donating money or supplies, etc.
- 5. What a great list! Now, we are going to take this list and use it to make a reminder of how we can love and help other people.
- 6. For younger participants, write each of the acts of service on a slip of paper using a marker. Give them the slips of paper to color. For older participants , you may wish to have them write the ideas on the slips of paper themselves.
- 7. Create a paper chain using the glue and strips of paper. Hang it in a visible place, so that it can be a reminder to "do justice and love kindness."
