Instructions:

- 1. What does courage mean? Being brave, doing the right thing even when it is hard.]
- 2. What are some ways you can show courage? Doing the right thing, even when no one else is; being willing to try new things, even if you might fail; telling the truth no matter what the consequences might be; facing your fears and working to overcome them; admitting your mistakes and learning from them.
- 3. Who are some people who have shown courage? [Queen Esther, Jesus, Mom, Dad, Martin Luther King, Rosa Parks, soldiers, police officers, firefighters, doctors.
- 4. Even though you may not be a queen

- like Esther, you can still be courageous just by doing the right thing. When you do the right thing, you make other people safe and happy, and you set a good example, too! But sometimes it can be really hard to know what the right thing is. When Esther needed courage, what did she do? [Prayed.]
- 5. Let's take some time to pray together for courage. Let's kneel like Esther did.
- 6. If they are comfortable doing so, invite students to share situations that they are worried or fearful about.
- 7. Lead a prayer based on their concerns, or use the following: **God, we know that you** are always with us, but sometimes we are afraid. We pray today especially for ... Give us courage like you gave Queen Esther. Amen.
