Praying Together

As an individual or as a group, what do you want to "agree on earth about" as you pray to God?



Blessing for the Week

End your devotions by tracing a cross on each person's forehead or hand with their permission and saying: **Jesus goes with you.**

Read Matthew 18:15-20 Church discipline. Sunday When you sin against someone, how would you want them to react? Read 1 Peter 2:11-17 Live good lives. God's love for us does not depend on Monday how we act, but our relationships with those we know and do not know do. How do you think you should act? Read Romans 13:1-7 Obey authorities. Does this passage mean that we should Tuesday not protest against our laws and government? Why or why not? Read Matthew 21:18-22 Jesus curses a fig tree. Wednesday What do you think is going on here? Read Genesis 37:12-36 Joseph is sold into slavery. Look at each character in this story. How Thursday do you think each of them feel during this scene? Read Genesis 41:53-42:17 Joseph's brothers go to Egypt. Friday What do you think each character here is thinking during this scene? Read Genesis 45:1-20 Joseph reveals himself to his brothers. What thoughts and feelings did Saturdav Joseph's brothers have in this scene?
