# **Key Verse:**

### The Point:

# Passover Living Slideshow

Act out the Passover instructions.

#### You will need:

### † Bibles

#### Instructions:

- 1. This activity was originally designed to be used in an intergenerational classroom with small groups. However, the instructions below have been adapted also for use by families at home.
- 2. Have your family or each group read Exodus 12:1-13; 13:1-8 out loud.
- 3. Assign each group one to five verses (depending on the number of groups you have). Families will create each scene in order.
- 4. Now we are going to tell this story by creating still scenes, like a photo, of the verses you have been given. You can think of this as acting out the scene, but as one image, without moving.

- 5. There are two rules: you must be silent, and you must use every person in your group. Families can leave a reader out of the scenes.
- 6. Once each group (or your family) has decided on the "slides," it is time to do our slideshow!
- 7. Read the story, allowing the groups or family to create their slideshow.
- 8. Possible scene divisions: Exodus 12:1-4 / 5-6 / 7/8-11 / 12-13 / Exodus 13:1-2 / 3-5 / 7-8.
- 9. Afterward:
  - Why was it so important for the Israelites to recreate that exact meal? [The ritual would help pass on that very important story.]
  - What important meals and rituals do we have in our families and in our church?
