The Widow of Zarephath 1 Kings 17:1-16 [17-24]



Key Verse:

The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord that [God] spoke by Elijah.

1 Kings 17:16

The Point:

God provides for us, often in ways we do not expect.

Unit Theme (November 1—November 22):

Small Group Discussion

Elijah declares a drought as punishment for Ahab's unfaithfulness but then flees Israel, first to an oasis east of the Jordan and then to a town to the north. Through miracles, God demonstrates that Elijah is indeed a prophet.

Read 1 Kings 17:1-7 – The Drought

- Solution By whose authority does Elijah declare the drought? What were the conditions?
- Why do you think the Lord sent Elijah to this wadi, outside of Israel?

Read 1 Kings 17:8-12 – The Famine

What is your reaction to the widow's statement that she is preparing herself and her son to die? Can you find a modern parallel in which such despair might be found, either in your own life or in current events?

Read 1 Kings 17:13-16 - The Promise

What would your reaction be to Elijah's demand if you were the widow?

Read 1 Kings 17:17-20 - The Doubt

Why do you think the mother turns on Elijah as she does? Does her accusation surprise you?

Read 1 Kings 17:21-24 - The Assurance

What do you think Elijah has learned over the course of this chapter? How has he grown into his role as a prophet?
