The Point:

Jesus brings good news for those in need.

Preparation:

- 1. If using newspapers, spread out sections so that there are many to look through.
- 2. If your family is not familiar with the Lord's Prayer, find the text online.

Instructions:

1. In the Lord's Prayer, the prayer that Jesus taught us and his disciples, we pray together "Your kingdom come, your will be done." Read the key verse (Luke 4:18) out loud. Jesus is describing those who are

- powerless or forgotten. When we pray for God's kingdom to come we are praying for justice for those people.
- 2. Look at Internet news sites or through a newspaper, and find a person, a group, or a place that is without justice or has no power.
- 3. Discuss the following questions:
 - Who is a part of God's kingdom?
 - How do we do God's will?
 - What are we praying for when we worship and pray together for God's kingdom to come in the Lord's Prayer?
- 4. Let's pray the Lord's Prayer as an act of worship and hope for God's justice to come.
- 5. Pray the Lord's Prayer together.
