
Worship Party

"Because my parents say so," answered Chloe Jackrabbit.


"Is it because God loves us?" quietly asked Olivia Porcupine.

Mrs. Heron flapped her wings excitedly. "Wonderful thinking! That is exactly right. Our worship service is like a party."


"It's not fun like a party," said Ethan, scratching his side.


"The canyon animals didn't throw a party for Mr. Skunk just to have fun. Why did they do it?" asked Mrs. Heron.

## For the Teacher:

Use these questions to reinforce the important story elements and help the students connect Sunday morning worship to the "thank you" party in the story.

- 1. Josh came into Sunday school mad because he did not want to go to church. Sometimes do you not want to go to church? [Answers will vary.]
- 2. Mrs. Heron told the students a story about a thank-you party for Mr. Skunk. What Mr. Skunk do for the animals? [He saved them from a hungry mountain lion.]
- 3. How did the animals show Mr. Skunk their love and thanks? [They threw a party, said 'thank you,' said how wonderful he was, and gave him presents.]
- 4. Mr. Skunk saved the animals from a hungry mountain lion. What did Jesus do to save us? [Jesus died on the cross and rose again.]
- 5. The animals threw a party for Mr. Skunk. What do we do every week to show Jesus our love and thanks? [We worship Jesus in church.]
- 6. When we worship Jesus in church, we are at a thank-you party! What is one thing you can do to show Jesus your love during the worship service? [Answers will vary.]
